- C. Faithfulness to the church. Acts 2:47; Heb. 10:25;2 Tim. 2:15; Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 16:2
- D. Teaching the word. Matt. 28:18-20; 2 Tim. 2:2
- E. Glorifying God with our behavior. Matt. 5:16; Acts 13:47; Eph. 5:8; Phil. 2:15
- F. Be a Christian at home. John 13:35
- G. A Christian can endure sorrow without losing hope. Matt.11:28, 29; Phil. 4:13

- A. First and foremost is salvation and membership in the church and our names in heaven. Acts 2:38; Mark 16:16; Acts 2:42, 47; Luke 10:20
- B. There is an earthly reward. Matt. 6:33; John 10:10

- D. Eternal rest from sorrow. Rev. 21:4
