- I. IF A PERSON WON'T LET ME SERVE THEM, OUR RELATIONSHIP IS NOT AS CLOSE AS I MAY HAVE THOUGHT. John 13:8
- II. AFTER DECIDING TO RECEIVE SERVICE, THERE ARE THOSE WHO WANT MORE THAN WE CAN OR ARE WILLING TO GIVE. John 13:9, 10
- III. A PERSON DOESN'T HAVE TO BE 99-44/100% PURE FOR US TO SERVE THEM. John 13:11
- IV. YOU AND I ARE TEACHERS BY WHAT WE DO AND/OR WHAT WE REFUSE TO DO.
 - A. Jesus was teaching the way to greatness that he had spoken of on other occasions. John 13:12-15; Matt.20:25-28
 - B. Our children, brethren, and others are being taught by our example of service.
- V. HAPPINESS COMES NOT FROM JUST KNOWING WHAT WE OUGHT TO DO, BUT FROM DOING WHAT WE KNOW IS RIGHT. John 13:17
