I. MY OWN SALVATION.

- A. The first time that salvation in the name of Jesus was preached people were told to save themselves.

 Acts 2:3640
- B. Paul encouraged people to tend to their own salvation. Phil. 2:12
- C. When Jesus gave the greatest commandments he talked about loving yourself. Matt. 22:37-39
- D. I cannot share what I do not have.

II. HUMILITY.

- A. This is a principle that goes way back. Prov. 3:34; 18:12
- B. Humility is a Christ-like character trait. Phil. 2:8
- C. In order to be humble, I must know who I am and properly love myself.

III. GROWTH.

- A. If a child or a Christian does not grow properly, it is a sign that something is wrong. 2 Pet. 3:18; Heb. 5:12
- B. Growth requires nutrition. 1 Pet. 2:2
- C. Paul was thankful for the growth of the Christians in Thessalonica. 2 Thess. 1:3
- D. If I am not making the effort to grow spiritually, then I will be easy pickings for Satan.
